This rewritten book originally came from two books: one written by Brother Lawrence (Nicholas Herman) of France who died in 1691 and Frank Laubach who died in 1970. Both tell of their journey to be in continual communication with God. What I received from reading this book follows.

Often we have heard "just 10 minutes a day" sit down with the Lord and spend "just 10 minutes" with him, give him that time. Have you ever thought of how much time the disciples spent with Jesus? They had to absorb his teachings in three years. That is 168 hours a week!

If we desire communion with the Lord surely it deserves more than 10 minutes a day.

We are admonished in scripture to "*pray without ceasing*". That's more than 10 minutes, it's constant, continual communication throughout our day. For me it's hymns I sing as I take my morning walk, as I stand in the checkout line, as I wait at the post office, as I shop at the grocery.

If one isn't used to this, here's a way that might help:

Begin with a desire to be closer to the Lord, as a friend is close. We have friends we talk to often. He is the best one. So set apart a specific time of the day to spend with him.

Talk to Him through out the day, wherever you are. Often when I am shopping I'll ask the Lord, is this really good for me? Should I buy this? Of course when we eat we stop and offer prayer over our food. When we face a decision do we ask his help? When we begin our day, even before getting out of the bed I talk to the Lord about the day and thank him for his protection over night. When we go to sleep at night the last thing on our minds should be to thank him for the day and go over the days blessings.

I have found that my attitude, mental thinking, and emotional well being are much more positive when I seek to continually be in communication with the Lord.

The positives outweigh any negatives. I believe this is a beginning to Absolute Surrender. I encourage you to read <u>Prac-</u> <u>ticing His Presence</u> if you desire a closer communion with the Lord.#

God gives us His church so we can be part of a group who are experiencing Him. From their responses, their testimonies and we come to a greater understanding of the closeness that we can never do on our own. Doug Smith

Nicolas was a business man, successful, had money, a shop but, he also had a problem with alcohol. He was an alcoholic. Because of the alcohol and because of other things, he and his family were estranged from each other and fighting. He felt he was disrespected and had no relationship with them. It got to the point, because of the conflict and things that were going on, Nicolas decided he was going to end his life.

He had a creative way of doing that. He decided he was going to get 10 liters of gasoline and pour it all over himself and all over his shop. He was going to burn up his business and himself at the same time. He was drunk at the time also.

He got the gasoline poured on himself and was sitting there ready to light the fire when he realized "It's mid-afternoon, if I burn this place down it's going to burn down a lot of people around me, so I'm going to wait until night time to burn myself." As he waited and sat there something told him ":Don't do this, go visit your nephew, Elijah".

It was night time, he really felt he should go visit his nephew-who happens to be a member of the church. And so he started on his walk to Elijah's house who lived a long way away. It took Nicolas 5 days to get there. As he walked he was just sleeping wherever he could find a place to sleep. One night he fell asleep among a pile of garbage. In the morning when he woke up the garbage had been set on fire. It was burning close to his face. Fortunately he wasn't burned. After 3 days he hadn't had any food or water and he was very hungry. He saw a lady standing by a bus stop looking all around as though she might have lost something. When the bus came and took her away, he walked over to the bus stop and, sure enough, he found some shillings and was able to have some food that day.

He finally arrived at Elijah's house. Elijah's wife called Elijah and informed him his uncle was there and "something is wrong with him". Elijah said "well, go ahead and let him in, I'll be home later and we'll talk about it." So she invited him in and he stayed there. Three days later, on Sunday, she said to him "well, it's Sunday, you are coming to church with us today". That was the last place Nicolas wanted to go but, he was a guest in their home and he decided he'd go to church with them.

He went and the sermon preached touched him. Nicolas said during that sermon something happened to him.

He was given hope. His life was hopeless and through the words he heard that day, as he said: "*Maybe there's hope!*"

The church where he was is a little different. They don't go to church only on Sundays, they go every day. They get up early before sunrise, and go to church before they start the day. In fact, during COVID it was illegal to meet. They would go and meet at 4:30 a.m. in the morning because the police didn't wake up until 6 a.m.

So as he began to go and be a part of that body he began to see some of the love of God, the love that God had for him, despite his being a hopeless alcoholic. He realized that God loved him. He knew he needed to change and he decided that he would do this "*baptism thing*". He would go and be baptized and he would see that God could make a new creature out of him.

And you know what? God did!

From the time he arrived at Elijah's home, he was able to be off the alcohol, and hasn't had a drink since. The Lord healed him of that addiction.

He was able to be baptized, he was attending church and the Lord began to work on his heart. He had left his family without any word. He didn't tell them where he was going, he didn't let them know he was alive, they just knew he disappeared that night. They had no idea where he was.

So, he got a job at his new place and decided to start sending his wife some

money. His wife started getting money from him. She didn't know he was alive, she didn't know where he was but he was sending some money at times.

After about 3 months we held a retreat. During the retreat we were talking about forgiveness, repentance, and reconciliation. The Lord worked on Nicolas's heart. He said: "*I've got to see if there's any chance that my wife would take me back*" We were having a communion service and Nicolas took the communion. Of course, the Lord says we are supposed to reconcile before we partake of communion. But, Nicolas told the Lord, "*Lord I'm going to do it Monday, let me take the communion today*". So He did.

Monday came and Nicolas gave his wife a call. To his surprise and wonderment she didn't reject him. She said, "Well, maybe". They began to talk. A couple of months later I (Doug) got a call from Wilson, the pastor, who said "Doug, can you bring the land cruiser (we use it as an ambulance in the clinic) we need to take Nicolas home to his family? This is the first time he will be going back and we would like to accompany him there." I said sure.

When we got there they asked if some of the congregation could come with us. Seventeen members of the congregation all crammed into the land cruiser and we drove to Nicolas's home and met his wife.

She was very skeptical about Nicolas. She thought she knew him pretty well. He had talked to her about meeting this Christian group and had become a follower of Christ. She didn't believe it. She didn't know about this group, what kind of weird organization is this anyway?

But after we had visited for the day she said, "I didn't know what kind of people Nicolas had gotten wrapped up in. But, today when all of you came to support him as he came home I knew it was real."

And so, Nicolas began the visit. It wasn't immediate. He visited on weekends. He came and shared with his wife and children the good news of who this God was that he had found.

As time went by he was finally able to return home, found another job, and an amazing thing happened. Because of Nicolas's testimony, because people could see what God had done in Nicolas's life, people said "*We want to be a part of that too*". So Nicolas's neighbors began attending services. People would come in and share with them. Pretty soon there was 10 baptisms, then a month later 12 baptisms, a month later 8 baptisms. Finally Nicolas's wife asked for baptism.

She shared her testimony: "You know I've been a liar all my life. Because, I've been a Christian and everyone kept asking me 'are you baptized?' and I was so desperately afraid of water that I said 'yes'. But I never was. Because I am afraid of going in the water.

Even on the day of her baptism she was still afraid. As she got up (she is not a young woman, she has arthritis and has trouble with her knees and hips) she said to herself: you know that water's going to be cold today. I'm going to go down in the water, my arthritis is going to act up. And besides that I'm so afraid of water.

But as she came down to the water the

elder, James, greeted her and said "*Relax*, *it's going to be fine*". *T*he next thing she knew she was looking at James and said "Is it over"? "*Yes, you're baptized!*" As she came out of the water, far from her arthritis acting up, her arthritis was healed. She had no pain as she come up out of the water and has had no pain since.

Nicolas's family was destroyed. There was no hope. Suicide was the only answer. God healed Nicolas and God healed his family relationship and brought not only Nicolas in communion with Him but the whole family, neighbors, the whole community.#
